BACKGROUND

ODISSeA - Organ Donation Innovative Strategies for Southeast Asia is an Erasmus+ project funded by the European Commission. The main objective is to design and implement an academic postgraduate program on organ donation in 8 universities from Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines and Thailand (SeA countries).

The origin of the project comes from **the need for a specialized training program** in SeA that builds adequate knowledge, skills and attitude in organ donation **to improve the number of well-trained specialists in the field.**

- Create an innovative specialised training program in organ donation
- Improve communication and collaborative opportunities (in SeA region)
- Set the basis of a network of highly qualified professionals in organ donation
- Support the establishment of organ donation systems in SeA

WORKING PACKAGES

1. Preparation

Get universities requirements for program accreditation. Collect related data from hospitals. Specify educational needs on living and deceased organ donation.

2. Development

Design the teaching plan. Develop academic and scientific contents, materials and tools. Implement the Postgraduate Program on Organ Donation. Evaluate of attitude, perception and knowledge and clinical outcomes in the hospital units.

3. Quality

Design and implement a Results Oriented Monitoring System. Ensure the achievement of quality of design, quality of training for trainers and quality of implementation of the Postgraduate program.

4. Dissemination

Ensure that project's results, products and deliverables are known and made available to the target groups.

5. Management

Prepare and plan the management board. Monitor the project activities. Supervise the Working Packages leaders and task development. Analyse project and team performance. Share the final conclusions and ensure the project's sustainability.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES



The postgraduate academic program will provide a common framework for 8 Universities from SeA countries to develop a student-centered lifelong learning strategy corresponding to highly specialized knowledge in organ donation.



The 280 healthcare professionals from the 8 SeA universities trained in the process of organ donation will be able to apply the acquired knowledge, competences and skills to their daily practice, aiming at improving organ donation rates.



Upon completion of the project, the Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) will have implemented a suitable adapted specialized postgraduate program on organ donation curricula, responding to the educational needs identified during the project.
